

DJ Player Instructions (14/05/2003)

Requirements	Written on Win98SE and XP computers so it should work under from 98SE onwards.
● Play List	This is where the players pull their files from. When you add files, they are checked by default. If you uncheck files, the player will not automatically load them in "Auto Load" or "Juke Play" modes but you may still drag them from the play list onto a player as normal.
Quick Play Buttons	Right click any of the 5 buttons (at the top of the main window) to load an audio file. You can then start and stop that file by normal left-clicking. They are intended for short sounds that need to be played multiple times. (sound effects, etc) The button text turns green while the sound is playing and returns to red when stopped. The hint displayed for each button is the file name loaded.
Play List Menu	You can add files to the play list using "Add Files" (adds to end of list) or "Insert Files" (inserts before selected file) as well as save & load play lists. Files are deleted by selecting it in the play list then pressing the delete key. Use "Clear List" to delete the whole play list in one go.
Options Menu	<p>Show Hints: If checked, hints appear when you hover the mouse over various buttons, etc.</p> <p>Show Extensions: If checked, files will show with their extensions. (e.g. .mp3) Leave this option unchecked to hide them. (only applies to new files added so far)</p> <p>Allow Cue: If checked, you may left-click the progress bar on the player to jump playback to that position. If the player is not currently playing, the file will be cued to that point instead. (only works with MP3 & WAV at present)</p> <p>Auto Clear: If checked, each player will clear the song from the player when it finishes. (but not if manually stopped) Uncheck this option if you want the player to leave the song loaded when it finishes playing.</p> <p>Auto Load: If checked, each player will load the next available song from the play list when the current one finishes. (but not if manually stopped) Playback will not start automatically unless "Juke Play" is also checked.</p> <p>Juke Play: If checked, the player will load the next available song from the play list when the current one finishes and start playback immediately. This option is only available when only one player is currently open.</p>
Virtual Players	You can open up to 4 software players by clicking "new player" in the file menu. Each player can either open its own files from the hard drive or pull them from the play list. You can even drag & drop them between the play list and the player and vice versa. The player supports whatever multimedia files that Windows Media Player (7.1) will play. It will even play the audio track from some MOV and AVI files. (not sure why'd you'd want to though!)
